Joke Book

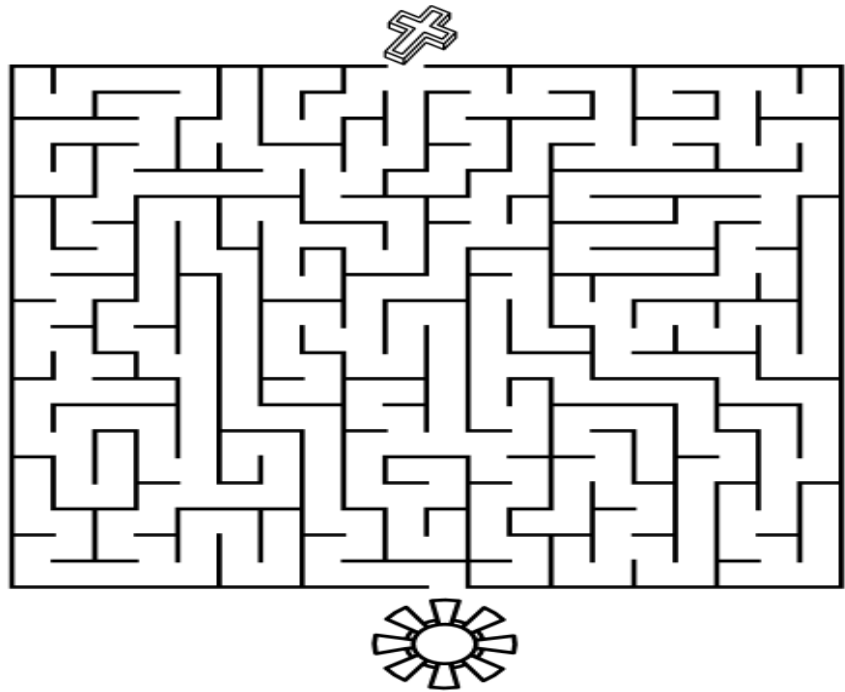
Why do bananas never get lonely?

Cardboard spinners

You will need:

String

Cardboard (a cereal box will do)

White paper

Felt tips



1. Cut out two circles from the white paper.
2. Colour in the circles, the brighter the better, as they will be more fun to watch as they spin.
3. Using a coloured paper circle as a template draw around it on the cardboard and cut out.
4. Glue one paper circle on each side of the cardboard.
5. Make two holes side by side right in the centre of the cardboard circle.
6. Take a piece of string about 70 cms long and put it through the holes and tie a knot at the end to create two large loops (one each side of the cardboard circle).
7. With a piece of rope in each hand twist the rope round and round.
8. Then pull the rope, loosen, pull, loosen and the circle will spin. You should also hear a humming noise.
