## Felt tip watercolour tree

### You will need:

Old felt tips in reds, yellows, oranges and greens

Brown pen

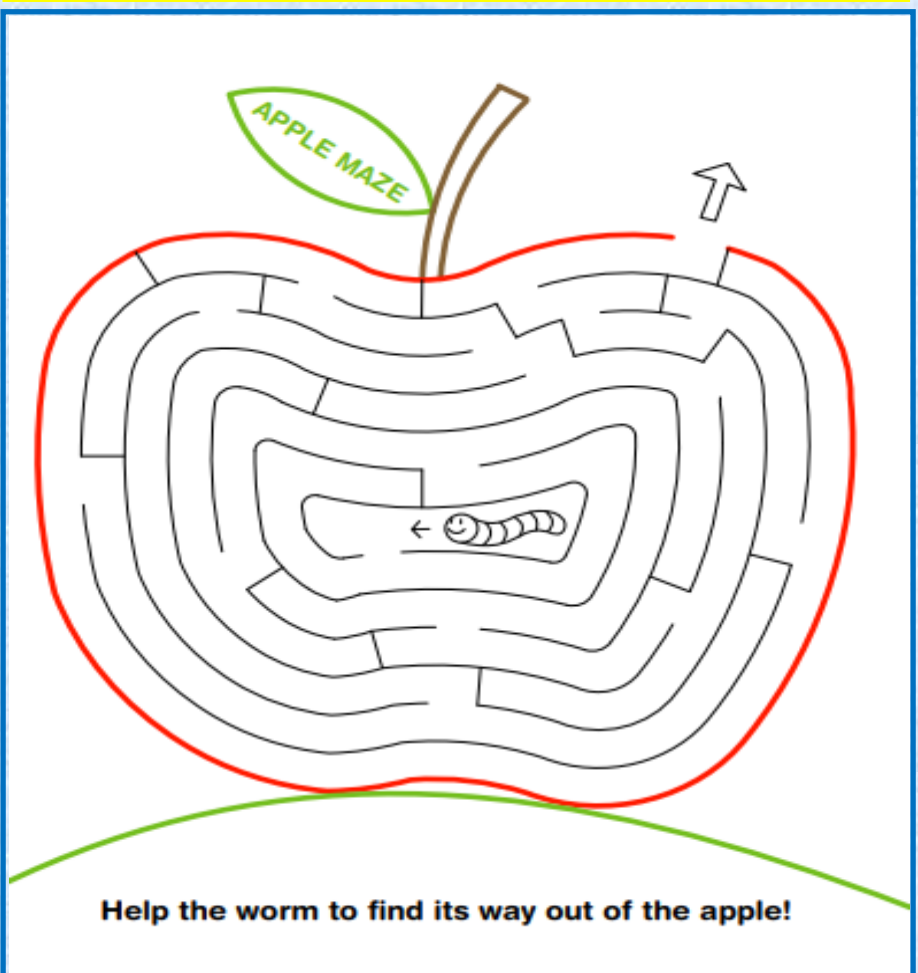
Thick paper



1. Paint a cloud shape (which will be the "leaves" of your tree) with water onto the top half of your paper.
2. Colour in the cloud with the old pens. The inks will run together.
3. When the cloud shape is completely dry, use the brown pen to draw on a trunk and branches.
