New Year

a reflection by Revd Keith Albans

Welcome to 2021 and, for the first time since 1991, this year is a semi-prime number – that is the product of two prime numbers (43 and 47). Another fact about the number 2021 is not repeated until we reach 23,073,409,469,011,482,307,340,946,901,147, but I'll let you work that out for yourselves!

Attitudes to New Year vary. On the one hand, the second at which 2020 became 2021 is no different from those which preceded it or follow it, so why bother marking it? Then again, there is something about starting afresh and going back to the beginning which is exciting and full of possibilities. But while I suspect most of us were glad to consign 2020 to history, judging by the week's news there will be much that is horribly familiar for at least the first part of 2021.

On Boxing Day I went with my grandchildren and their parents for a walk round Moorlands nature reserve. It's one of my favourite spots, particularly in May when the Azaleas are in full bloom. Last weekend it was cold and damp with bare wood everywhere, but with signs of hope if you looked - bulbs showing through on the ground and, as the picture shows, buds on the branches. Rather like the



news of a second approved vaccine, the dismal present can be illumined by the possibility of what might yet be – not always obvious, but there to be glimpsed and imagined.

This week we enter the season of Epiphany – or manifestation. The Magi had little idea of what they were looking for when they set out but, like Abraham, they knew that setting out was important in opening up divine possibilities. It led them to discover God present in a small child and brought them to their knees in worship. We none of us know what 2021 will bring or where we will end up, but let's at least set out in hope, believing that God is there to be glimpsed along the way.

The Parish Pass entitles church members of parishes and benefices in the Diocese of York to visit York Minster and the Undercroft for sightseeing during normal opening hours.

In 2021, the Parish Pass scheme is going digital!

Due to the impact of Covid, in a change from previous years, those planning to visit York Minster need to *make a reservation in advance*, because the number of people visiting each day is strictly limited. You need to make a reservation for a specific date and time from the www.yorkminster.org website.

NB. When you visit you need to take proof of residency in the Diocese, a copy of the Parish Pass and your reservation.
