Let us Sing!

A reflection by Revd Canon Terry Joyce

There's so much that we've not been able to do over the last year, but as we now look forward to better days ahead, I realise that I've so missed singing in church. It might only seem a small thing in the big picture, and I'm really thankful that there have been wonderful opportunities to maintain worship online and through the few 'in the flesh' services that have been available. But I'm now ready to be able to let out the praise of God in our corporate worship through some of our fantastic hymns and songs.

Even though we've had words available, casting our eyes over them or even speaking them is a lesser experience than singing them. Singing reaches the parts of us that words alone cannot reach. Singing is an affair of the whole person, in which not just the voice and body, but also the mind and the heart are involved. Singing with others is also different to singing alone. I know there is more to worship than singing. However, without the opportunity to sing, worship seems a limited experience. On one occasion when the apostle Paul describes what happens when Christians come together, it is the singing of "a hymn" (literally a 'psalm') which heads the list of activities (1 Cor 14.26).

Paul also wrote "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly... and with gratitude in your heart sing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs to God" (Colossians 3:16). So I look forward to the day when we can all tear off our masks and fulfil the injunction of James "Are any cheerful? They should sing songs of praise" (James 5.13). To adapt the words of Charles Wesley's dedication of his original collection of hymns, congregational singing 'raises or quickens our spirit of devotion, it confirms our faith, and it kindles and increases our love to God and to others'. Let us sing!
