Disruptive Art - John 2.13-22

A reflection by Revd Nick Bird

The Server gathers up the collection from the Churchwarden in a large shiny brass plate, and hands it to the priest. The priest throws the whole shebang into the air, with coins and copper clattering to the ground, the oversized plate spins dented into a noisy corner, and a flutter of notes make their way slowly to the ground. The priest takes a bow and exits stage left.

I don't think I'd have the guts to do it, but Jesus, in the story of the cleansing of the temple, is both the great disrupter, and something of a performance artist, and he might just pull it off. The crowds would have



been as bewildered and cross as the congregation, especially if the clergyperson had unwound their girdle, handled it like a whip, and chased the choir from the building. If nothing else, it would go down in legend!

Jesus doesn't remonstrate with the money-changers sitting at their tables, or tick off the sellers of sacrificial animals. Instead he enacts his critique of what is going on, and instead of the focus being on the temple and its rituals of worship, the attention moves sharply to this wandering preacher. Why does he do it?

Partly, I would suggest, because Jesus is the Great Disrupter, and challenges convention and convenience at every stage throughout his public ministry. Partly because he fearlessly goes against the religious powers, taking them to task for their demands and contradictions. And partly because he is shifting the location of God's glory, and human worship, from a building to a person. We should perhaps underestimate neither the drama, nor the enormity, of his action.

As it has been said, on our journey through Lent toward Easter, 'we, too, should be careful lest we miss God's earth-shattering Word in our midst. Rather than coming to a physical temple, or church building, we need instead to come to Jesus'.

Flames and Rushing Wind at the End of the Tunnel?

From the Superintendent Minister:

Following the Government's announcement of a phased relaxation of Covid regulations, and discussions with the Circuit Staff and Stewards and the Leaders of Worship and Preachers Meeting, we have all agreed that the provisional target date for a general re-opening of Churches for Sunday Worship is **23rd May** - the Festival of Pentecost and Aldersgate Sunday. Ministers and Local Pastors will work with each congregation to explore what will be required to reopen, and what pattern of Sunday Worship might be possible. More details will be available after Easter.

Assuming that the Government's timetabled announcement for 12th April goes ahead, it would seem reasonable to invite those user groups who rent our buildings, and whose activities are covered by the relaxations promised for that date, to make their plans for the summer term. **Please note the words 'provisional' and 'assuming'** - nothing is certain as yet, but hopefully over the next 4-8 weeks things will become clearer.
