#### A reflection for Stir-up Sunday from Judith Hewitt

In the Common Worship Lectionary (the chosen readings for a particular day) this coming Sunday is Christ the King, but if we look back in prayer books it will be referred to as Stir-up-Sunday.

Why?

Stir-up Sunday gets its name from the opening words of the collect for the day in the Anglican Book of Common Prayer: "Stir up, we beseech thee, O Lord, the wills of thy faithful people".

But Stir-up Sunday is a festive tradition associated with the Victorian era. On Stir-up Sunday, families traditionally get together in their kitchen to mix and steam Christmas pudding. I can remember as a child gathering together with the rest of the family on a Sunday, not sure if it was Stir-up Sunday to all stir the pudding and to have a wish after my father had added the brandy.



Christmas puddings are made so far in advance of Christmas Day to give them time to mature, in particular so that the alcohol really infuses the pudding. There is also a tradition that the pudding would have 13 ingredients to represent Jesus and his disciples.

This coming Sunday, 21<sup>st</sup> November, is also the last in the Churches year. As with all endings of the year a time to look back over the last twelve months, but as Advent begins on 28<sup>th</sup> November the chance to look forward to what God has planned for us in a new year.

In the words 'Stir up the wills of your faithful people' we are asking God for something important. We are praying that God will stir up our wills, so that we might get on with doing the good works that he has planned for us to do. Then, as a consequence, we pray that we might receive our abundant reward.

#### **Collect for Stir-up Sunday**

Stir up, we beseech thee, O Lord, the wills of thy faithful people; that they, plenteously bringing forth the fruit of good works, may of thee be plenteously rewarded; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
