A reflection from Rev Dr John Schofield

Advent is upon us. We celebrate God's promise to send a Saviour to rescue us, as promised of old, to be a present reality, and as the one who culminates history at the end of time.

When Moses encountered the burning bush (Exodus 3), he asked for God's name and was given a word often translated as "I AM who I AM" (written as four Hebrew letters: the Tetragram). It is the Hebrew verb "to be". (This is like French conjugation of être: Je suis; Tu es; Il est; Nous sommes; Vous êtes; Ils sont). But the tense of the word of 'being' is simultaneously past, present and future: God is for all times eternal. (And isn't 'Je suis' so much like 'Je sus'!)

Advent in looking at the prophets' call culminating in John the Baptist's ministry, and at Mary accepting her role in God's plan for salvation sets God's revelation and call in the past, our present, and also the future. I hope you hold on to this season's glimpsing of eternity in the preparations for Christmas, and don't hurry too much towards the 25th December.
