Love + Injustice = Transformation

a reflection by Revd Keith Albans

In physics, an interference pattern is what happens when two or more waves interact – some get higher, others cancel each other out – things are changed. I'm sure that's how we're meant to live our discipleship – not keeping everything in discrete boxes but bringing them into the same space and experiencing the fruit of the interference!

subject and the particular

So this Sunday I offer you three waves. It's Valentine's Day – which behind the rampant commercialism is a celebration of human love and cherishing. Secondly, it's Racial Justice Sunday, which is a challenging reminder that racial injustice is still the lived experience in our society, not just on the surface but systemic and deeply engrained. The third wave is the set gospel reading for this Sunday – Mark's account of the Transfiguration.

I'll leave you to make the interference pattern – if you want some pointers look up the URC's materials for today <u>https://ctbi.org.uk/</u>rjs-2021-resources. And the realisation that Mark 9:3 offers a disturbing example of the equation "White = Holy and Pure" is a good place to start.

The famous song says, 'Love changes everything'. Being in love, being loved and loving all affect our perception of reality – and when love is real, that changed perception affects everything and marks us for life. And whilst it was Jesus who was transfigured, it was the changed perception of his friends that marked them and helped them make sense of the path Jesus had chosen. In her poem 'In God's Image' Karen Campbell challenges us to integrate that same life-changing love with racial justice.

Why must my life be constrained by your norms, Your customs, Your rules, Your ways, Your judgment of who or what is acceptable – Or not? Who gave you the monopoly on 'rightness' – And rightness in whose eyes? Love others as you love yourself – Or maybe, as you would wish to be loved. And judge not in case you too Are judged. So says our Parent God -In whose image We both are made.
