A reflection on Wesley Day - from Rev Dr John Schofield

Dear friends,

Wesley Day is a day celebrated by Methodists, which recalls the day in 1738 (24th May) when the Anglican Rev'd John Wesley MA attended an evening group meeting in a Moravian church on Aldersgate Street, London, where on hearing Martin Luther's Preface to 'Paul's Letter to the Romans', as it was being read out, felt that his heart was "strangely warmed". He received an experience of assurance of new birth, in and through Christ Jesus. This was the pivotal event in Wesley's life that ultimately led to the development of the revivalist Methodist movement and ultimately to the formation of Methodists churches, after his death.

According to his daily journal, "I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone, for salvation; and an assurance was given me that he had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of sin and death."

Interestingly John's brother Charles (famous for writing many hymns) also had a similar experience of being justified by faith, just three days' earlier at Pentecost, 21st May. The two brothers formed a key part of the revival movement that then swept England and was derogatively called Methodist because of its systematic approach to Christianity with regular meetings for Bible reading, prayer and fellowship.

And so, many Methodists celebrate this day, and its salvation message on the Sunday before the 24th of May, each year.

Let Me Entertain You

Dear friends,

Hell is gone and heaven's here

You may be more or less familiar with the classic back-catalogue of Mr Williams, but he may have a point. The fact that this song is full of innuendoes and double entendre is not insignificant (you may need to explore the interweb for the full verse and chorus, if you don't already know it by heart, of course). We are told one thing, but are provoked to imagine another.

I have heard it suggested that many people, should you give them a comfortable enough pillow and soft enough bed, would choose to sleep their lives away. The desire to escape into dreams, or hide in alternate worlds that give life a double meaning, is seductive. Others do this with alcohol or narcotics, video games or role play – basically fun, but fundamentally escapist. A BBC article earlier this year reported that 'people are spending an average of 4.8 hours a day on their mobile phones'. Who needs to engage with the real world if one can pour oneself into the virtual one?

Double entendre, by their nature, say one thing, but direct you toward another. They promise, but by sleight of hand, deliver something else, or, most likely, nothing at all. The small screen offers an alternative to reality, even though it is real enough in itself, and redirects you to something other. There are few in this world who are brave enough to walk through life sober, awake and with eyes wide open, and those who do we call 'mystics'. Escapism, distraction, and allowing entertainment (even when beautifully sung by the lovely Robbie) to overtake what surrounds us in its own technicolour seems a poor second choice. How many ways do you find to anaesthetise the way you encounter the world?

Meditation and contemplation on the other hand, and in its many forms, are just that. It is the positive choice to observe reality as it is, both interior and exterior. It is the decision to not shy away from what may be beautiful or disturbing, but rather, as the Jesuit theologian Walter Burghardt put it, to give 'a long, loving look at the real'. Observing a flower, taking time to be fully present to another person, sitting quietly with the sensations of the body, watching one's thoughts as they pass through, embracing the uncomfortable moment, these are all ways to awaken the soul.

May your eyes and heart, your mind and body, be open to the actual, the real and the material. Take a break from simply being entertained, or from sleeping your life away in a dream.

At our May meeting we welcomed 38 members, plus 3 new ones and 2 visitors to a very full agenda, however 10 of us still managed to go to the local afterwards to continue our conversations.

We had the privilege of an extra speaker giving us their personal experiences of being diagnosed with ADHD a year ago as an adult. She explained that if she had been diagnosed sooner it would have helped her during school and university. Her talk gave us extra insight and helped us decide to vote via our delegate for the resolution to be adopted at the annual meeting in Liverpool this month It is, "Women and Girls with ASD and ADHD: under-identified, under-diagnosed, misdiagnosed, under-supported."



Our main speaker, Rachel Poulton, a former paediatric nurse and social worker, and her family have for many years welcomed young unaccompanied asylum seekers into their home. She gave heartrending accounts of the struggles and abuse these children suffer in making their way to the UK and the difficulties they face in adapting to life here. Rachel's commitment to helping these poor young people and the wholehearted way that her and all her family cherish them is truly awe inspiring. Now they are also helping Ukrainian families find homes and access all that helps them settle here in York.

It felt appropriate to suggest a "Memento from your childhood", as our competition theme, what do we treasure, when these youngster's often leave their homes with nothing or have whatever they bring taken during their journeys here. Audrey Willits was the winner who brought her treasured teddy bear.

Our WI were delighted to be asked by the Parish Council to get involved with the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations in Dunnington on Friday 3rd June. Look out for us on the green and in the Reading Rooms. Here's hoping the sun shines.

Our next meeting on Tuesday June 7th is slightly different, we are using the small room and begin at 7.30 with just a speaker and no other business. Linda Robson from Age UK York will be talking about Lasting Power of Attorney, wills, and other related matters, with time for any questions as always. Something we all need to think about, but often put off.

As well as the Jubilee celebrations in June we are also hosting our own "Strawberries and Cream Afternoon Tea" on 21st between 2-4 in The Reading Room. Bring your neighbour as well as your friends and family, everyone is welcome.

Don't forget the WI is not just about "Cake, Jam and Jerusalem", come and join us adding to the mix, things YOU are passionate about. See you soon, a warm welcome awaits you.

Bee Friendly Trail – Say Hello to a Higher Mow

Dunnington Green Initiatives Group warmly invites you to join in with the Bee Friendly Trail fundraiser over the 23rd & 24th July. We're encouraging our community to show a little love for our bees and other pollinating heroes (e.g. butterflies, moths, hoverflies, wasps, beetles) by growing pollinator-friendly plants and creating a celebratory bee-themed display for the trail weekend. Whether displaying or not, kids can also take part in an art competition to be launched (hopefully in time for half term) on Dunnington GIG's Facebook page (or see July issue).

Our 'How to Bee Friendly & Sign Up for the Trail' note (on our Facebook page, at St Nicholas Church and in the next issue) makes clear that to join in you just need a pollinator-friendly plant out front and a pollinator-themed decoration – the level of commitment is up to you (from a potted marigold with a knitted bee bought from our pre-trail sale J to a front garden filled with bee-friendly blooms and an elaborate scene such as a 'bee buffet', a 'spelling bee', or a 'wanna-bee').

In the last issue, our budget-friendly tips included sowing seeds, cadging a cutting, clubbing together for a discounted deal and a bag of peat-free compost, and using your pre-existing plants (check they're pollinator-friendly at Flower Finder https://beekind.bumblebeeconservation.org/home.php). Next up, ever noticed that a buzz-cut lawn doesn't buzz with bees? How about ditching the dessert of low-cut lawn in exchange for higher growth that allows for bee-friendly nectar-filled flowers (and is less likely to go brown in a drought)?

Perhaps you've done No Mow May and you want to continue with your mini meadow – great news for a range of wildlife! If that's too wild for you, putting your mower blade at its highest setting and mowing a little less often makes for a good compromise, especially if you're lucky enough to have low-growing species in your lawn. So, 'Bee the Change' (https://www.bumblebeeconservation.org/beethechange/) by 'letting it bee'. Let the clover take over and remember, you can't keep a good daisy down.

Friends of Hagg Wood

In the warm dry early Spring it was wonderful to experience the beauty of Hagg Wood. The fantastic display of wildflowers rewarding our efforts to hold back the brambles and promote good growing conditions along the rides and ditch margins. I'm sure there have been more primroses than ever before. Birdsong also seemed to be increasing with even more willow warblers, blackcaps and chiffchaffs. In early May there had been a lot of concern amongst birdwatchers about the poor numbers of hirundines (swallows, martins and swifts) making their way back to England. There were strong sandstorms in The Sahara in early April which may have delayed their return.

More encouraging have been increased sightings and hearings of Cuckoos. We used to hear this interesting bird around Dunnington from April to mid-June, when many adult birds return to Africa, but it is five years since I have recorded their presence, although one of our readers reports hearing the Cuckoo twice in Hagg Wood last April. Cuckoos target several host species but most common are meadow pipits, reed warblers and dunnocks. Amazingly cuckoos can specialize in a particular host and lay an egg which closely matches the target bird's, and this has been the subject of many fascinating evolutionary studies. For a bird of its size and resembling a sparrowhawk,, a cuckoo is not often seen in flight and much more often heard than seen.



THE BIRDS IN YOUR GARDEN

Swifts, Swallows, and House Martins



A recent article in the Guardian talked about the precarious situation of Swifts, Swallows and Martins as climate change continues to accelerate. In it there was an estimate that, this year, the main arrival of most migrants from Africa, in April, was roughly 10 days later than usual. This was in contrast to a tendency over recent years for them to arrive ever earlier. Results from BirdTrack, organised by the British Trust for Ornithology, confirm this, showing that Swallows, Sand Martins and House Martins all arrived one to two weeks later than expected, and generally in lower numbers.

Two reasons were suggested for these late arrivals. Unlike many other migrants, which fatten themselves up before they depart and transit from one refuelling point to another, these insectivores feed as they travel, replenishing lost energy by catching insects on the wing. Which means that they are particularly vulnerable to bad weather en route. And the weather in southern Europe this spring – notably in southern Spain, which they pass over after leaving Africa – has been very unsettled, with heavy rainfall, strong winds and even falls of snow across parts of Andalucía. In 2021 also, there were heavy storms over the Mediterranean during their peak migration period. Quite a contrast to the span of hot dry summers that has contributed to the continued loss of autumn migrants, such as Cuckoos, but equally, a result of climate change.

More direct human actions are not always helpful either. Safeguarding stopover sites along the flyways has been shown to be vital for the survival of many migratory species. But many of these, such as the Tagus Estuary in Portugal where there are plans to build an airport, are already under threat, endangering thousands of migrant birds. Population incteases in many such areas add yet more pressure on resources and it is not clear what the future holds for these migrant species.



Even when they do make it back here to breed, Swifts, Swallows and Martins don't have an easy time of it. Nesting sites are becoming fewer each year as houses are upgraded, with plastic replacing wood, leading to fewer nooks and crannies to attach nests to. BTO surveys reported that birds which build nests on PVC as opposed to brick, concrete or wood had much lower breeding success - probably because nests were less able to adhere to the PVC. Some sympathisers are providing artificial nests on their homes to encourage breeding birds, and some new houses incorporate special hollow bricks for them to nest in. While these artificial nests might not be used, they can encourage efforts to build nests nearby.

Yet a further complication in the saga, and one with as yet unknown consequences, is that with the run of mild winters in recent years a small number of Swallows has attempted to spend the winter months in the UK. The BTO's BirdTrack received almost a hundred reports of up to a dozen individual Swallows in Britain & Ireland between January 1 and February 1 last winter. Most were seen in the warmer south and south-west of Britain and Ireland, and if they can survive, avoiding migration could be a real advantage.


Make what you will of all these changes, but one thing is clear. The future of most species of migratory birds, both garden visitors and others, is in the balance. There is much that can be done to help them, but many of the vital stopover areas are in war-torn or impoverished countries where the survival of passing birds is of little consequence.
