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Good Friday

Over his head, they put the charge against him: this is Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews.

Christ humbled himself for us, and in obedience accepted death, even death on a cross.

Almighty Father, look with mercy on this your family for which our Lord Jesus Christ was content to be betrayed and given up into the hands of sinners and to suffer death upon the cross; who is alive and glorified with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Amen.

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Easter Eve

Grant, Lord, that we who are baptised into the death of your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ, may continually put to death our evil desires and be buried with him; and that through the grave and gate of death we may pass to our joyful resurrection; through his merits, who died and was buried and rose again for us, your Son Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

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Easter Day

Lord of all life and power, who through the mighty resurrection of your Son overcame the old order of sin and death to make all things new in him: grant that we, being dead to sin and alive to you in Jesus Christ, may reign with him in glory; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be praise and honour, glory and might, now and in all eternity.

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8 April

Annunciation of Our Lord to the Blessed Virgin Mary

The Holy Spirit will come upon you, Mary, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. [Alleluia.]

The Word of God, begotten of the Father before time began, humbled himself for us and was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary. [Alleluia.]

Mary received the word of the Lord and conceived the Word of life. [Alleluia.]

We beseech you, O Lord, pour your grace into our hearts that as we have known the incarnation of your Son Jesus Christ by the message of an angel, so by his cross and passion we may be brought to the glory of his resurrection; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

8 April

The Annunciation of Our Lord

The story of the announcement of the coming of God made flesh in the person of his Son, Jesus the Christ, the Anointed One, is heard in today's proclamation of the good news from the gospel of Luke. The feast marks the conception of Christ in the womb of Mary and has been celebrated in the Church since at least the late fourth century. The perfect humanity and the complete divinity of Jesus is affirmed, following the controversies around those orthodox assertions, which themselves led to the acknowledgement of Mary as *Theotokos*, God-bearer, which in the West became translated as Mother of God. The celebration thus took on strong associations with the person of Mary, and became known in England as Lady Day. In recent years, the Church has re-affirmed the day as a Feast of our Lord, on which his virgin-mother still has a unique place of honour.

William Law

Priest, Spiritual Writer. 1761

William Law

Priest, Spiritual Writer

Born at Kings Cliffe in Northamptonshire in 1686, William Law was educated at Emmanuel College, Cambridge, and after ordination as a deacon, became a Fellow of the College in 1711. When George I came to the throne in 1714, William declined to take the Oath of Allegiance, being a member of the non – or party who believed the anointed but deposed monarch James II and his heirs should occupy the throne, He lost his Fellowship, but in 1728 was ordained priest, and in the same year published, 'A Serious Call to a Devout and Holy Life', which much influenced such people as Samuel Johnson and John and Charles Wesley. In it he stresses the moral virtues, a personal prayer life and asceticism. He returned to Kings Cliffe in 1740, where he led a life of devotion and simplicity and caring for the poor. He remained there for the rest of his life and died on this day in the year 1761.
