#### **From your Rector**

#### Retreat - Going back to go forward

I've recently been on a retreat with the Northumbria Community near Alnwick, so I thought I'd explain what retreating is and a little about Celtic spirituality. Retreat in a military operation is a drawing back while maintaining contact with the enemy, and can be done to relieve the pressure on troops or to lure the enemy into a different position before attacking again - and both of these ideas have connection with spiritual retreat. Christian leaders are encouraged to take times of retreat when they come away from their ministry, and usually away from home too, to rest, pray and take stock. Being in a third space that is not work or home allows for more objectivity on situations and time that is less structured to enable prayer, meditation, Bible study and other reading. Retreatants often return refreshed, with a new sense of vision and readiness for ministry again.

My retreat was guided, which means that there were structured times of worship, learning and discussion with others as well as individual unstructured time. We explored 'the footsteps of St Cuthbert', visiting some of the places where Cuthbert lived and worshiped, and we prayed together using the Celtic liturgy. Modern Celtic spirituality looks back to the saints of the 'Dark Ages' for inspiration, drawing on simplicity, community and connection to nature and location in its prayers and reflections. Cuthbert in particular was someone who spent much time alone with God, living at times on the remote Inner Farne island; yet he was also consulted by kings and was for a time the Bishop at Lindisfarne.

This pattern of togetherness and aloneness was something we contemplated on the retreat, and indeed mirrors retreat itself: taking a step back from daily duties and relationships gives perspective and the opportunity to seek God's guidance for our personal lives and in our ministry with others. I certainly recommend taking a retreat, and hope you too can create that time and space to step back, in order to move forward.



## **GIFT AID/HOLTBY TRADER ANSWERS**

#### **GIFT AID MYTH BUSTERS**

The Gift Aid Scheme and Gift Aid Small Donations Scheme are very important components of the general income for the churches in the Benefice of Rural East York, so a "Big Thank You" to those who already gift aid their offerings and donations.

Gift Aid recovery is a totally free gift, a present, from the Government.....now who doesn't like a free gift/present??? The churches receive 25p for every £1 you give with Gift Aid – at no cost to you!!

There are a number of myths surrounding Gift Aid which make some people reluctant to gift aid their donations, but don't let them get in the way of you signing up!

#### Here are some "Gift Aid Myth Busters"

I'M A PENSIONER, GIFT AID DOESN'T APPLY TO ME

Not true. Many pensioners have income streams which are taxable, or pay capital gains taxes on investments – these tax payments qualify for Gift Aid, up to the amount of tax paid.

THE TAXMAN (HMRC) WILL SELECT ME FOR AN AUDIT OR REVIEW PAST TAX RETURNS

No. Gift Aid filings do not trigger anything in HMRC's database, but are solely to ascertain if you're a taxpayer on record. No connection to your past tax returns or an audit will result.

MY INFORMATION WILL BE SOLD OR USED BY OTHER CHARITIES

No. Your details are protected by law, only to be used by the charity to which you donate.

I'M A HIGHER RATE TAXPAYER; I'M NOT ELIGIBLE

Yes, you are! If you Gift Aid your donations, the churches can claim an extra 25p for every £1 that you give, and you can reclaim the difference between the basic and higher rate of tax for yourself when you complete your tax return.

I'LL HAVE TO KEEP TRACK & DO MORE PAPERWORK

All you need to do is complete **one** Gift Aid Declaration form, which can cover all your donations to the church – and that's it! You don't have to complete an annual tax return. The church can provide you with a statement of all your donations annually if you wish.

MY TAXES WILL GO UP IF I CLAIM GIFT AID

No. Gift Aid is retrospective and has nothing to do with future taxes; it's for tax already paid.

So, if you do not already gift aid your offerings or donations and think that you may be eligible, then please prayerfully consider your position and complete a Gift Aid Declaration form, which can be obtained from your church treasurer or gift aid officer. Please pass the completed form to the relevant person in your church.

If you are still unsure about your position then your treasurer or gift aid officer will be happy to have a *confidential* chat with you to assess your situation.

#### **Dunnington GIG Springs into Action!**

Dunnington GIG has been springing into action this Spring. Since every food chain starts with a plant, we're focusing on encouraging and enabling folk to grow more in '24!


Our village's pollinators will be delighted that so many wildlife-friendly residents will be sowing GIG's Freebies for Free Bees – 130 packs of seeds gone before the end of March! The Pollinator Plants Pop-Up at the church's Community Cafes followed; with sunflower and marigold seedlings offered on a 'give as you feel' basis to raise funds for more eco-friendly heating at the church.

GIG helped Dunnington Primary School to apply for free fancy fruit trees through the Tree Council's Orchards for Schools scheme. They were gifted five fantastic maidens (apple, pear and plum) which were planted just before the end of the tree planting season. Given the heavy, wet clay, a team effort was required with class representatives within the School Council and parent volunteers giving a much needed helping hand. Thank you to everyone involved.

Then, for the Easter hols, GIG joined forces with the dream team at the library for a fun event with a very pleasing turnout. The children enjoyed crafting pollinators; beautiful butterfly sun-catchers and Marmalade Hoverflies. They also planted seeds for easy-to-grow, long-flowering, pollinator-friendly Pot Marigold. This One Pot Wonder also has edible petals and can be grown as a 'companion plant' for pest control, able to attract greenfly-munching hoverflies. Again, a thank you to the volunteers who made the event such a success.

Lastly, a note on weedkillers. You may be aware of increasing concerns about the impact of these toxins upon biodiversity; research suggests herbicides harm bees, earthworms, and songbirds. There are concerns about their impact upon human health too. For example, the WHO has listed glyphosate (common weedkiller) as 'probably carcinogenic' and the EU Commission has recommended minimising its use in public areas such as parks and playgrounds. So, for everyone's sake, let's put the spray away.

At our April meeting 51 members and 5 visitors were educated by Chris Bridge, a former headmaster, who is a long-term volunteer and current trustee at Yorkshire Arboretum.

He began his talk with a brief history of trees, which have been in existence on Earth for over 450 million years. His presentation contained stunning images of some of the trees growing in the Arboretum and covered many fascinating aspects, including the development of increasingly sophisticated reproductive methods and the use of pheromones to deter predators and to communicate to other trees.

Chris then spoke about the creation of the enclosure at the Arboretum, built entirely by staff and volunteers, and the subsequent introduction into that enclosure of red squirrels, 2 female and 1 male. Against expectations, the squirrels have bred in their first year in residence, producing 12 young. Images of the babies brought 'oohs' and 'aahs' from the audience.

Chris will confirm dates when he is leading the free Thursday morning tour so that a trip can be organised.

The competition, 'A wooden ornament' produced 31 entries, the most anyone could remember. It was won by May Arnett with a small statue of a bear, beautifully carved to show the grain of the wood.

Our next meeting is on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> May at 7.15pm when our speaker is Melanie Fox from York Women's Refuge, which is run by the charity IDAS (Independent Domestic Abuse Services)

The competition is 'Personal Protection'.

There will also be a Food Bank collection at this meeting.

Don't forget on May 21<sup>st</sup> it is our Full Afternoon Tea between 2-4, come along with your friends and family for delicious food and a warm welcome.

Let's hope for more sunshine and less rain this month, but you won't feel wet or miserable at any of our WI events. Come and see for yourself.



#### **Friends of Hagg Wood**

May is a wonderful time to visit the wood and also see the continuing improvements that reward the efforts of so many people who volunteer for our work parties or financially support our group. To walk through on a sunny spring day and see the wood anemones and primrose in bloom and the sight of a bumper bluebell display really lifts the spirits.

One of the most joyful experiences in Hagg Wood in May is the dawn chorus, although it has been building up over a longer period. If you get a bright sunny morning in late January, you might hear the Song Thrush or Great Tit warming up for the big show, joining Robins who sing all year. Like many species, they need time to get into their rhythm, with their song building in quality and intensity as Spring fully kicks in. By mid-March lots of our resident birds are in full song and in mid-April, the riot of sound is in full effect as millions of migrant birds pour back in from Africa to their summer homes. In early May the chorus is at its peak, but it can be heard in some form into early summer.

Why do so many birds sing at dawn? Birdsong has been shown to carry 20 times further at dawn, making all that effort to attract a mate much more worthwhile. For the males, it is also a reminder to their rivals that they have survived the night and are in fine fettle, with the strength, skills and stamina to sing. Many summer visitors arrive at night, increasing the competition, so the birds already here sing their hearts out first thing to let the new arrivals know who's boss.

Our next conservation working parties are on Saturdays 4th May, 22nd June and 6th July from 10am to1pm. On Thursday 30th May at 3pm in the Reading Room, Ewan Downey will give an illustrated presentation on "The White Rose Forest project and Rewilding". Details of our AGM in May, which is only open to FHW members, will also be sent to our members.

On Saturday June 1st there will be a party at Dunnington Sports Club from 2.30-4.30 pm with the Dunnington Community Choir and a local folk group to celebrate the public right of way re-opening. Further details are available on our website www.fohw.org.uk.

#### YORK WHEELS LTD. TO END DIAL AND RIDE SERVICE

York Charity 'York Wheels Ltd.' ended on 31st December 2023.

The Dial and Ride bus service provided travel options for York residents who are elderly or disabled and have no other means of travelling. It offered a door-to-door service where drivers assist passengers with their shopping. Buses were equipped for people who have difficulty walking and for those who use wheelchairs.

#### Rob Atkinson, Chair of the York Wheels Ltd.'s Trustee Board said,

"It is a matter of deep regret that the Dial and Ride service has become unsustainable in recent months. Put simply, we have reached the point at which as a result of problems with maintenance and third-party suppliers, our fleet is not up to the standards required to maintain the quality or reliability of the service, despite a helpful grant from City of York Council earlier this year.

We recognise that this will be distressing for some customers, but we'd like to reassure them that we will maintain our volunteer car driver scheme where customers can book a car in advance to collect them and take them to their destination. We encourage all our customers to make use of that alternative help. The charge for that service depends on the distance travelled. To book ring 01904 630080."

#### **Dunnington Reading Room Requires a new Trustee-Can you Help?**

Dunnington Reading Room is held on trust with the Charity Commission (Charity No. 506542) for the purposes of a village hall for the use of the inhabitants of the Parish of Dunnington.

The Charity is run on a day to day basis by the Management Trustees who are mainly representatives of key groups within the village eg the Church, WI, Dunnington Playing Fields Assoc. Etc.

In addition to the Management Trustees there are also Property Trustees (PT's) who have no responsibility for the day to day running of the Charity but are the custodians of the property on behalf of the village. The PT's are responsible for communicating with the Charity Commissioner in the event that the Management Committee cannot form a working Committee to continue to be responsible for the day to day working of the charity. At that stage they will have the right to act on behalf the village until such time as a new Management Committee can be formed or otherwise.

There are currently three Property Trustees and due to the retirement of a long standing Property Trustee an opportunity exists to take on the role.

There are four Committee meetings each year including an AGM where the Management Trustees vote for a Chairperson, Treasurer, Booking Secretary and Maintenance Manager. The PT's are welcome to attend the Committee meetings and can take part in discussion but cannot take part in any of the decision making votes.

The power of appointing a new Property Trustee rests with the Management Trustees.

#### THE BIRDS IN YOUR GARDEN



It's that time of year again, with garden birds whizzing around full of energy, looking to pair up and produce the next generation. As with everything in nature though, the more you find out about how apparently simple things happen, the more you realise that they are not simple at all.

To produce this next generation the female bird must first lay eggs, a process which requires a lot of energy. Taking a Blue Tit as an example, the female, typically weighing around 20g, will lay about 10 eggs, each weighing a gram or so. That's half her body weight in eggs over a period of a few days. She must be in top condition and find enough food to provide the energy for this process.

Protecting the egg is about half a gram of shell, for which the calcium must also come from her food. Laying females are known to stop their normal feeding bouts to find a calcium resource just prior to roosting as they cannot store calcium. This will often be snail shells, though some invertebrates do contain more calcium than others.

The female Blue Tit does most, if not all the incubation, which takes about a fortnight. So, whilst energy consumption might be lower, feeding opportunities are fewer, and if it is cold or wet, the amount of energy consumed keeping herself and her brood warm will be significant.

The next stage is also energy demanding, this time for both parents. Growing chicks can eat as many as 100 caterpillars a day which, for a brood of ten, approaches 1,000 caterpillars, almost one a minute during much of a 16-hour day. This continues for around three weeks. If one parent is lost, maybe due to a cat or a Sparrowhawk, the chances of survival for the brood are very low – even in good times only about a third of chicks will survive their first year.

Dietary requirements are paramount: nestlings need a high protein diet if they are to grow quickly enough to fledge within three weeks, and this comes mainly from caterpillars, which contain about 50% protein on a dry weight basis. Supplementary food can be very useful at this point, as it helps sustain the adults during their frantic search for food more suitable for their ever-hungry young.

Another consequence of all this hard work is feather damage. Blue Tits like to nest in cavities, hence their liking for the bird boxes we provide. Just think of the wear and

tear of going in and out of a 25mm hole several hundred times a day. This is why, once the young have fledged, the adults will moult, replacing pretty much all their feathers over a period of 4-5 weeks. Growing feathers also requires a lot of energy, and whist sedentary birds such as our Blue Tits have plenty of time before cold weather arrives, migratory species don't have this luxury, and must replace at least their flight feathers before setting off for Africa.


For 'our' Blue Tits, it's then time to recover from this vital and energy rich period, and prepare for the onset of winter.
