Reflection for Pentecost Sunday by Judith Hewitt



Waiting is hard even if it is something we are looking forward to. The disciples have been through so much in a relatively short time.

They have met Jesus, spent time with him, learnt from him, been encouraged by him. Then they see him die a cruel death, rise from the dead and spend time with them before he ascends to his Father in heaven.

While Jesus was with them, he said his Father would send an Advocate, the Holy Spirit, to above all remind them of all Jesus has told them. That same Holy Spirit continues to remind disciples today of all Jesus taught.

We have been, and possibly still are, celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Elizabeth was not born to be a queen, but when her father became King, she became a Queen in waiting. She would have been prepared for that time, which came much quicker than she thought.

While she was waiting for her Coronation, she had a little book of Bible readings and prayers, written by the then Archbishop of Canterbury to prepare her spiritually for that day.

The Holy Spirit was, and still is her guide. The Queen, at her Coronation committed her life to the country and to God who she has trusted throughout her reign.

One of the last prayers in her book is:

God be in my head and in my understanding God be in mine eyes and in my looking God be in my mouth and in my speaking God be in my heart and in my thinking God be at my end and at my departing.
