Reflection on Luke 10.38-end by Revd Mark Poole



The reading from Luke's gospel tells the familiar story of when Jesus visits the home of Martha and Mary. Martha is running around like a headless chicken presumably preparing food, washing up, laying the table, sweeping the floor and goodness knows what else. In the meantime, her sister, Mary, chills at the feet of Jesus seemingly mesmerised by all that he has to say. This story is often viewed as a lesson in the importance of 'being' rather than 'doing'. Jesus says to a disgruntled Martha, 'Martha, Martha, you are distracted by maany things, there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her.' Jesus seems to value adulation over action, devotion over duty.

I feel sorry for Martha! If we weren't blessed by the dedicated service of the Marthas of this world, then little would get done. Yet on the other hand, unless we take time to 'be still and know that I am God' then we are in danger of never knowing the fulness of life God intends for us.

But Jesus' response to Martha is rather enigmatic. 'Being' rather than 'doing' can only be inferred. I wonder whether Jesus' response to Martha has something more profound to reveal.

Mary took a big risk choosing to sit at the feet of Jesus. Custom and tradition meant that men gathered in the central courtyard of a Middle Eastern home whilst the women, toiled away hidden behind the scenes with the aim of serving the men and meeting their needs. Mary should not have been there. Mary deviated from cultural norms. Mary let go and surrendered herself to Jesus. Maybe this act of letting go is the 'only one thing' that matters.

For Mary to sit at Jesus' feet was countercultural, and the notion of surrender and letting go is also countercultural in contemporary society. Letting go sounds like losing. But it is in this act of surrender to God that we access our true inner selves and discover an abundance of life that is already there. And that abundance of life is Love itself. John the Baptist describes letting go like this: 'I must grow smaller so he can grow greater.' (John 3:30) I believe this is the 'better part' that Mary chose. And Jesus invites us to choose it too.
